

What it is not...

- Onerous or punitive

Guiding Principles



- Partnerships are in the infant stage – nurture the relationship first and foremost
- Ensure partners are fully informed of the purpose of ongoing monitoring
- Prioritize – what’s the most important information the partner needs to know over the first 12 months, 18 months...

Guiding Principles




- Not everything has equal weight or importance – the system can grow and mature overtime
- If partners are expected to assume additional responsibilities, provide the resources from the partnership funding to fulfill those responsibilities
- Individualize expectations – meet partners where they are



A Parallel Process



An effective ongoing monitoring system...



Monitoring Activities

- Divide paper into 3 columns.
- Label columns:
 - Column 1: What are you monitoring?
 - Column 2: Who is responsible?
 - Column 3: What is the frequency?
- List items and respond to the question in each column

What Did You Discover?



- Are there gaps in the monitoring activities?
- Are you developing a system of ongoing monitoring reflective of the needs of your EHS CC partnership?

Ongoing Monitoring at the Partnership Level



Scenario #1

During the initial 18-month time frame, Environmental Health and Safety content area experts visit your EHS-CC partnership sites to conduct the baseline assessment. They identify that the lock on the gate is rusty and not working properly. This could have become a bigger problem if not caught in time.

What is your next move?



Scenario #2

During a quarterly meeting with your EHS-CC Partnership site, you review a binder containing injury & incident reports. You notice that during the last 30-days, there has been a 25% increase in documented injuries. What does this data suggest and how might you support your partner around this issue? What systems are impacted?
