
Teachers Make a Difference

Research demonstrates that Head Start teachers and staff help economically disadvantaged children make gains in learning and development that prepare them for school. Recent studies show that the interactions between teachers and children matter even more than previously thought. When teachers create positive emotional relationships, organize the learning environment effectively, and focus on cognitive and language development, children can make even greater gains that help them succeed in elementary school and beyond.

A Framework for Success

To consistently put these essential lessons into practice, teachers need resources that are relevant to their setting, easy to use, and proven to work. And they need support, feedback, and training along the way. The National Center on Quality Teaching and Learning will:

1. Collaborate with Head Start trainers and teachers to create a library of best practices in curriculum, instruction, and assessment that are aligned with the Head Start Child Development and Early Learning Framework and demonstrated to be effective in a variety of real-world settings;
2. Teach Head Start trainers how to use assessment information of classroom practices and to provide coaching and feedback to help teachers increase effective interactions with students; and
3. Develop new, higher education opportunities so that early learning teachers can access credit-bearing courses and professional development resources when and how they want.
