



Office of Head Start Disaster Recovery Funding for 2017 Hurricanes



\$637,500,000

Available to award until September 30, 2021.

The 2017 hurricane season was among the most destructive in history, with Harvey, Irma, and Maria affecting Florida, Texas, Puerto Rico, and the U.S. Virgin Islands. For necessary expenses directly related to the consequences of Hurricane Harvey, Hurricane Irma, or Hurricane Maria.

Information & Restrictions

Grantees are not limited to a single application and can be funded incrementally based on specific project needs.



Project and budget periods will be two years.

Extensions with an end date no later than September 30, 2026 may be given at the discretion of ACF.

Eligible grantees will receive Disaster Assistance funds as a separate grant award from their base Head Start and Early Head Start operations grant(s).

Funding decisions will be made based on an identified connection to the consequences of covered disasters, documented need, and availability of funding.

Currently, 10 Regions (all except Regions I and II) include covered declared disaster areas. For necessary expenses directly related to the consequences of:

- Hurricanes Florence & Michael
- Typhoon Mangkhut & Super Typhoon Yutu
- Wildfires and earthquakes occurring in calendar year 2018
- Tornadoes and floods occurring in calendar year 2019
- AND in those areas for which a major disaster or emergency has been declared under section 401 or 501 of the Robert T. Stafford Disaster Relief and Emergency Assistance Act
