The approaches to learning domain:

- Focuses on how children learn.
- Refers to the skills and behaviors children use to engage in learning.
- Incorporates emotional, behavioral, and cognitive self-regulation as well as initiative, curiosity, and creativity.
- Cognitive self-regulation skills are also referred to as executive functioning.

Focus for Today's Webinar: Initiative and Curiosity

Whether climbing onto a couch to retrieve a toy, building increasingly elaborate block structures, or deciding on the roles in pretend play, young children draw upon their curiosity, persistence, and creativity to gather information and solve problems. Many factors influence how children approach learning. Some children seem to be born risk takers who are eager to try something new, while others prefer to observe for a while. As children with disabilities learn how to learn, they may require more individualized instruction and accommodations to aid with sustained attention or regulation of feelings.

Why are initiative and curiosity important?

- Curiosity helps children be more observant and to think about things and try to figure them out.
- When children explore their curiosity, they expand their vocabulary as they use language to describe what they're thinking, seeing, hearing or experiencing.
- Greater curiosity in early childhood is associated with greater kindergarten reading and math academic achievement.
- Simply being in a state of heightened curiosity makes us more susceptible to learning new knowledge.



Using the 5Rs to Support Initiative and Curiosity




Relationships

- Build trusting relationships as a base for learning
- Support professional development based on individual choice and need
- Create a safe space for trying new things
- Providing guidance for implementation of best practice; reinforcing best practice; walking the walk by doing rather than directing

INITIATIVE & CURIOSITY

Curiosity Principles (Cushman, K. 2010)

- 1. Embrace not knowing
- 2. Ask fewer, but deeper questions
- 3. Address "20/80" engagement and replace undirected with directed questions
- 4. Use questions to elicit thinking not correct answers
- 5. Wait for it
- 6. Allow curiosity to be followed



Resources

- Providing responsive resources and varied, concrete presentation modalities
- Translating theory to practice in doable chunks
- Providing peer learning opportunities
- Seeking external and internal supports for identified needs in the learning environment
